WEDNESDAY: THE KING CALLS - MARK 1:1-20

WHAT DO WE KNOW ABOUT THIS CALL?

- I. The call comes from the One who is the fulfillment of Scripture [Kingdom Background]
 - i. Isaiah prophecies of Jesus over 700 years before his birth
 - ii. ls 40:3 A voice of one calling:

"In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord[a]; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

- iii. Deut 18:15
- iv. Gen 3:15
- v. He is God!
- II. The call comes from the One who is authorized by the Father [In-breaking Kingdom]
 - i. The Heavens are torn open v.10
 - ii. The Spirit descends v.10
 - iii. Verbal authorization "This is my Son" v.11
- III. The call has important placement in the Book [Kingdom Purpose]
 - i. It's the first thing we hear Jesus say:
 - ii. "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!"
 - a. He is the King of the Kingdom.
 - b. Kings don't make suggestions they issue summons
 - c. Not only is He God, but He is King.
