Caring Well for Your Missionaries

(including those who are responsible for others' Member Care)

- key component—for them to know they are loved and remembered
- pray regularly for worker on the field and on their home ministry assignment (HMA); keep up with their prayer requests & follow up on them; (see suggestions on reverse page)
- listen, Listen, LISTEN!
- rejoice & weep with them while they're on the field and on HMA; don't respond with "I don't know what to say" which focuses on you instead of them; yet don't be silent as it feels like a turning away
- ask "how may I help" before they arrive for HMA; be in tune with those needs whether it be
 housing, furnishings, car, kids' schools, arranging dr./dentist appts, etc; be creative about how
 needs can be met
- be sensitive about saying "welcome home", especially to kids who've lived mostly overseas
- provide basic staple items for fridge and pantry to get started (you'd be amazed how many expired items are given!)
- help locate appropriate resources needed in parenting, marriage issues & things such as learning disabilities on HMA/field; share sermons, books, etc that have helped you
- invite them into your family life for a home-cooked meal & include them in social activities, as well as small groups, bible studies, book clubs, gym, etc.
- lend a helping hand—babysitting, dishes, food, laundry, cleaning, yard work
- ask them for an Amazon Christmas wish list (or for things needed 1st time to field); give gift cards for Amazon, Walmart, restaurants, gas, movie theatre, etc when they arrive for HMA
- help fund retreats, conferences, books, summer camp for kids while on HMA
- donate air miles so their college/adult kids can visit or so worker can visit family
- adopt college MKs whose parents are far away—prayer, goody boxes, holiday invitations, holiday/summer accommodation, help getting driving license
- welcome a high school MK into your home for a summer to experience life in the US as a teenager before moving there after high school, especially if you have believing teens of the same sex; help teen get driving license
- arrange a video call with small group from your church or with just yourself; keep up with how they're doing & their prayer requests; phone or text them to check in with them
- pray, Pray PRAY! (see reverse for suggestions)

Praying for Your Missionaries

(The most common prayers for missionaries are probably for health and safety. However, most missionaries would probably not put these at the top of our list.)

- diligence in God's Word and faithfulness in prayer
- protection from the evil one; standing firm in midst of temptation
- strong marriages and close-knit families
- children to be godly and well-adjusted, to love the host culture and to have godly input in their lives from people outside their families
- representing Jesus in such a way that others may be drawn to Him
- wisdom in daily use of time; discernment for member care workers
- energy, patience and stamina for the long-haul
- godly perseverance and encouragement, especially in adverse circumstances
- growing daily more like Jesus; encouraging teaching from the Word from whatever sources
 possible on each particular field—worship service, Bible studies, helpful books/talks, podcasts,
 etc.
- aptitude for local language and cultural sensitivity
- good friendships within host culture; ability to maintain a close friendship in home country
- heart friends with whom to share burdens and joys; friends who initiate communication and not leave it up to them
- true Christian community among team, national co-workers and local church
- comfort in being separated from friends and family, especially children and grandchildren
- joy in the Lord and in the ministry
- faithful and sacrificial prayer and financial supporters; adequate financial support
- open doors for the Gospel and a fruitful harvest
- finishing well whether that be to move to another field or for retirement
